Report Highlights:

On July 22, 2004, the Secretariat of Treasury announced in the *Diario Oficial* (Federal Register) the addition to Annex 21, of the official customs ports of entry for U.S. imported poultry products. These official customs ports of entry are consistent with SAGARPA's import requirements. No adverse impact on imported U.S. poultry is expected.

Introduction: This report summarizes an announcement published in Mexico's "*Diario Oficial*" (Federal Register) on July 22, 2004.

FAS/Mexico's Executive Summary: The Secretariat of Treasury (SHCP) announced in the *Diario Oficial* (Federal Register), on July 22, 2004, the addition of paragraph XX to Annex 21 of the General Regulations on Foreign Trade for 2004, which contains the authorized ports of entry for specific products. This paragraph contains the custom ports of entry for poultry products. The HTS numbers are: 0207.11.01, 0207.12.01, 0207.13.01, 0207.13.02, 0207.13.03, 0207.13.99, 0207.14.01, 0207.14.02, 0207.14.03, 0207.14.04, 0207.14.99, 0207.24.01, 0207.25.01, 0207.26.01, 0207.27.01, 0207.27.02, 0207.26.02, 0207.26.99, 0207.27.03, 0207.27.99. The custom ports of entry continue to be the same as those allowed by the poultry import requirement sheets issued by the Secretariat of Agriculture, and are, as follows: Agua Prieta, Cancun, Ciudad Juárez, Colombia, Manzanillo, Matamoros, Mexicali, Nogales, Nuevo Laredo, Piedras Negras, Reynosa, San Luis Río Colorado, Tijuana, and Tuxpan. No adverse impact on imports of U.S. poultry is expected.
