

**TABLE 18**

The table below presents a 28-year record of the differences between the October projection and the final estimate. Using world wheat production as an example, changes between the October projection and the final estimate have averaged 7.5 million tons ( 1.4 percent) and ranged from -26.7 to 9.5 million tons. The October projection has been below the final 19 times and above the final 9 times.
