

Sugar Monthly Import and Re-Exports

Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 - Final Sugar Report

The final FY 2016 WTO raw sugar tariff-rate quota (TRQ) shortfall is 125,057 short tons raw value (STRV), 35,069 STRV higher than last month's estimate. The country details are shown on Table 3.
